Paul though a follower of Christ and an apostle writing to the Phillipians still desired to know Christ..

The desire to know is probably what is missing in the church and believers of today.Many are comfortable at the stage they already know him as long as I have what he promises to give ,many feels what is the essence and importance of knowledge,they feel what is needed is to gain only and am ok

Can i make money?

Can my battles be won?

Can get this and that?

However they forget "When the idea of knowing Christ is jettisoned any goods of life/ miracles gotten are only temporal".

This is because the enemy will often strike and when there's no root and knowledge of Christ ,the wind will blow such person away.

"The one on whom seed was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and at once welcomes it with joy;"

yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful."

Matthew 13 : 20-22 KJV

So freedom is accessed in the knowledge of Truth and this truth is Christ that you carefully seek and know.

"As he spake these words, many believed on him. Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

Even after all Paul has become in Christ at the time of writing this book,He sought 3 things that will truly indicate that he has known him...-

- Power of his resurrection
- Fellowship of his sufferings.
- Conformity with his death

These 3 important points are what believers must seek on daily basis...

### 1. Power of His resurrection...

This is best described in Romans 8:11 "And if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit, who lives in you."

#### Essentials of the power of His resurrection

##### A). The power of his resurrection Guarantees our Salvation

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,"

1 Peter 1 : 3 KJV

...If when Christ died he did not resurrect..there would be no message in Christianity today..there are people that were dead and were raised up by others..but none had died and rose up himself.

"Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live [together] with Him, because we know [the self-evident truth] that Christ, having been raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has power over Him. For the death that He died, He died to sin [ending its power and paying the sinner's debt] once and for all; and the life that He lives, He lives to [glorify] God [in unbroken fellowship with Him]. Even so, consider yourselves to be dead to sin [and your relationship to it broken], but alive to God [in unbroken fellowship with Him] in Christ Jesus."

Romans 6 : 8 - 11 AMP

##### B). The power of his resurrection guarantees relationships with God through the Holy Spirit.

Acts 1:8....

"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation; to wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation. Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God. For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him."

C.) The power of his resurrection Guarantees eternal life. John 3:36

“He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.”

2.The fellowship of His sufferings..

What it means to suffer with Christ.... “

“Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me.”

Matthew 16 : 24 KJV

“Enjoying the resurrection of Christ and all its benefits without partaking in His suffering is a scam”

Jesus never promised a no suffering life...

“who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God. For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ. And whether we be afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, it is for your consolation and salvation. And our hope of you is stedfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so shall ye be also of the consolation.”

## How to Suffer with Christ...

### 1. Take up your cross and follow him:

Taking up our cross means being willing to surrender our lives and even die for the sake of following Christ. “

For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.”

Romans 8:18 KJV

Jesus didn't paint a rosy picture of discipleship. Instead, He said, “If you try to hang on to your life, you will lose it. But if you give up your life for my sake, you will save it. And what do you benefit if you gain the whole world but are yourself lost or destroyed?” (Luke 9:24–25, NLT).

Just before Paul spoke of the “fellowship of His sufferings,” he said his goal was to know Christ “and the power of His resurrection.” As we share in hardship and persecution on our downward path to the cross, Jesus is our companion on the journey. He promises never to leave us alone (Matthew 28:20). Christ is a living Savior who pledges to impart His resurrecting power and give us the strength to endure and even overcome (Romans 8:11; Philippians 3:10; John 16:33).

### 2.) Count it all Joy James 1:2-4

We tend to find joy in our circumstances. Vacations, relationships, promotions, when life is going up and to the right we are joyful. But the Bible talks about joy differently; joy in our circumstances is fleeting. But there's a more secure joy that we can have even in the middle of a storm. That's the joy James is talking about. One that can be experienced even in the difficult moments in life.

Dr. Tom Constable in his commentary says this, “He did not advocate a masochistic attitude that unnaturally rejoices in painful experiences.

Rather he commanded them to view their trials as profitable even though unpleasant. Another translation of “all joy” can be “pure joy.” The opposite would be “some joy”.

### 3: Conformity with his death..we must die daily

The participle "being made" is present, and implies a process that is going on and will continue through life — not an act like justification, simultaneous with the exercise of faith. "Made conformable" means being cast in the same form, being brought into such a community and likeness that one sketch, outline, shape,

will represent both.

- If we're being conformed to the death of Christ, we will experience Christ in His death for the release, impartation, and multiplication of life (John 12:24-26; 2 Cor. 4:12), and the divine life within us will be released to be imparted into others, thereby being multiplied.

-When we are being conformed to the death of Christ, spontaneously the divine life within us will be released, and our God and Father will be glorified.

-The more we are being conformed to Christ's death, the more we will glorify the Father, and the more others will be drawn to Christ.

Such an attraction of others to Christ comes through the release of life as an issue of our conformity to Christ's death.

CONCLUSION. The best of any man or woman cannot be above the "extent to which he knows" How much of Christ do you know?

1. Power of His resurrection...

This is best described in Romans 8:11 "And if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit, who lives in you."

Essentials of the power of His resurrection

A).The power of his resurrection Guarantees our Salvation

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath be gotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,”

1 Peter 1 : 3 KJV

...If when Christ died he did not resurrect..there would be no message in Christianity today..there are peo ple that were dead and were raised up by others..but none had died and rose up himself.

“Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live [together] with Him, because we know [t he self-evident truth] that Christ, having been raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer h as power over Him. For the death that He died, He died to sin [ending its power and paying the sinner’s d ebt] once and for all; and the life that He lives, He lives to [glorify] God [in unbroken fellowship with Him]. Even so, consider yourselves to be dead to sin [and your relationship to it broken], but alive to God [in unb roken fellowship with Him] in Christ Jesus.”
