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This is best described in Romans 8:11 "And if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead lives in yo u, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit, who lives in you."

Essentials of the power of His resurrection

A). The power of his resurrection Guarantees our Salvation

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...If when Christ died he did not resurrect..there would be no message in Christianity today..there are peo ple that were dead and were raised up by others..but none had died and rose up himself.

"Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live [together] with Him, because we know [t he self-evident truth] that Christ, having been raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer h as power over Him. For the death that He died, He died to sin [ending its power and paying the sinner's d ebt] once and for all; and the life that He lives, He lives to [glorify] God [in unbroken fellowship with Him]. Even so, consider yourselves to be dead to sin [and your relationship to it broken], but alive to God [in unbroken fellowship with Him] in Christ Jesus."

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B). The power of his resurrection guarantees relationships with God through the Holy Spirit. Acts 1:8....

"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation; to wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation. Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God. For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him."

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C.) The power of his resurrection Guarantees eternal life. John 3:36

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What it means to suffer with Christ....

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"who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God. For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, s o our consolation also aboundeth by Christ. And whether we be afflicted, it is for your consolation and salv ation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, it is for your consolation and salvation. And our hope of you is stedfast, knowing, that as ye are p artakers of the sufferings, so shall ye be also of the consolation."

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How to Suffer with Christ...

1. Take up your cross and follow him:

Taking up our cross means being willing to surrender our lives and even die for the sake of following Christ. "

For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us."

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Jesus didn't paint a rosy picture of discipleship. Instead, He said, "If you try to hang on to your life, you will lose it. But if you give up your life for my sake, you will save it. And what do you benefit if you gain the whole world but are yourself lost or destroyed?" (Luke 9:24–25, NLT).

Just before Paul spoke of the "fellowship of His sufferings," he said his goal was to know Christ "and the p ower of His resurrection." As we share in hardship and persecution on our downward path to the cross, Je sus is our companion on the journey. He promises never to leave us alone (Matthew 28:20). Christ is a living Savior who pledges to impart His resurrecting power and give us the str ength to endure and even overcome (Romans 8:11; Philippians 3:10; John 16:33).

2.) Count it all Joy James 1:2-4

We tend to find joy in our circumstances. Vacations, relationships, promotions, when life is going up and t o the right we are joyful. But the Bible talks about joy differently; joy in our circumstances is fleeting. But th ere's a more secure joy that we can have even in the middle of a storm. That's the joy James is talking ab out. One that can be experienced even in the difficult moments in life.

Dr. Tom Constable in his commentary says this, "He did not advocate a masochistic attitude that unnatura lly rejoices in painful experiences.

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3: Conformity with his death..we must die daily

The participle "being made" is present, and implies a process that is going on and will continue through lif e — not an act like justification, simultaneous with the exercise of faith. "Made conformable" means being cast in the same form, being brought into such a community and likeness that one sketch, outline, shape,

will represent both. - If we're being conformed to the death of Christ, we will experience Christ in His death for the release, im partation, and multiplication of life (John 12:24-26; 2 Cor. 4:12), and the divine life within us will be release d to be imparted into others, thereby being multiplied. -When we are being conformed to the death of Christ, spontaneously the divine life within us will be releas ed, and our God and Father will be glorified. -The more we are being conformed to Christ's death, the more we will glorify the Father, and the more oth ers will be drawn to Christ. Such an attraction of others to Christ comes through the release of life as an issue of our conformity to Ch rist's death. CONCLUSION.
